

The Bachelor's in Addiction Counseling degree completion program prepares the graduate to assess the needs of clients and populations and to plan and implement programs and services that will assist in promoting improvement in personal and social functioning. Students will acquire the knowledge and skills to provide direct client services in sincere and compassionate relationships.

In addition to direct services, students will learn the structures and underlying forces that characterize organizations and communities and the role that diversity plays in the functioning of larger groups. Basic knowledge of organizational management principles are provided as well as concepts relating to program advocacy and support development. The techniques and formal tools of conducting needs assessments and



outcomes measurement and evaluation are presented to introduce students to the effective monitoring of interventions and programs. The program also provides general education coursework in advanced oral and written communication, sciences, philosophy, and economics.
